

1 **Salvador Gaytan:** Welcome to SmileTalk, an entertaining and informative dental talk
2 show, featuring the latest news and developments in dentistry. I'm
3 Salvador Gaytan, here with...
4

5 **Dr. John Chao:** Dr. John Chao. Hi, everybody. We're going to have a great show.
6 This Christmas season we'll be opening our topic to more general
7 items than what we've been doing.
8

9 **Salvador Gaytan:** Are you changing the subject matter on me, Dr. John?
10

11 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, I'm going to make it a little bit more comfortable for you,
12 because there'll be less technical and more seasonal.
13

14 **Salvador Gaytan:** More seasonal. Well, you know that it is true, because like you say
15 that the Christmas season is a little bit more festive, a little lazy
16 and so you want to make it -- well, and we do say that the show is
17 going to be entertaining as well.
18

19 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, it would be entertaining and maybe perhaps a little less
20 informational, dentally speaking. So, we're going to enjoy
21 ourselves and hopefully our audience will also enjoy it with us.
22

23 **Salvador Gaytan:** Now, we do have a very interesting show. We have a little bit
24 about some interesting dentistry topics, but a little more on the
25 entertaining side. We are also going to talk a little bit, give our two
26 cents about the current situation with someone who has a very
27 good and famous smile, and who is that?
28

29 **Dr. John Chao:** Tiger Woods, I've always liked his smile.
30

31 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yes.
32

33 **Dr. John Chao:** So, we're going to talk about him for a little bit.
34

35 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yes.
36

37 **Dr. John Chao:** And I have some sage advice for him from the dentist point of
38 view.
39

40 **Salvador Gaytan:** You have some advice for Tiger, to get him out of his current
41 situation?
42

43 **Dr. John Chao:** That can maybe save him from future events, maybe save him
44 from some injuries.
45

46 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, this we're going to have to hear, Dr. John.

47
48 **Dr. John Chao:** Okay.
49
50 **Salvador Gaytan:** I like it; I might chime in with a little advice myself on this one.
51
52 **Dr. John Chao:** Alright, okay, we'll compare.
53
54 **Salvador Gaytan:** We're going to get to our Rapid Fire Five, which is more on the
55 entertaining side today, but you also -- we have some music that
56 you want to play for the audience, don't you?
57
58 **Dr. John Chao:** Well, I'm not going to play it right at this moment, but we have it
59 recorded.
60
61 **Salvador Gaytan:** Exactly. Let me just set this up, you are, in my opinion, you are an
62 accomplished pianist and you've played the piano for a long time.
63 You've actually composed this tune that the audience is about to
64 hear, isn't that right?
65
66 **Dr. John Chao:** Actually I arranged it. It's an old tune. It's an old Christmas Tune,
67 so I arranged it on the piano with some electronic assistance. So, I
68 enhanced it a little bit, so I'm not that great of a piano player, but I
69 think it sounds pretty good.
70
71 **Salvador Gaytan:** Alright, maestro, let's hear what this sounds like.
72
73 [Music Playing]
74
75 **Dr. John Chao:** I grew up with these sounds, being that my father was a minister.
76 How do you like it?
77
78 **Salvador Gaytan:** I love it, and are you saying that the -- you composed this entire
79 arrangement?
80
81 **Dr. John Chao:** I didn't compose it, I kind of arranged it.
82
83 **Salvador Gaytan:** Okay. What did you do?
84
85 **Dr. John Chao:** Well, I played a part of it and some of the background I arranged
86 with electronic software. So, part of it is actually mine and part of
87 it is edited into the song.
88
89 **Salvador Gaytan:** I see.
90
91 **Dr. John Chao:** So, the real fancy stuff actually I'm not playing.
92

93 **Salvador Gaytan:** So, you customized the *Little Town of Bethlehem*, but there's
94 another twist though, you have a whole CD of Christmas Music,
95 and the audience can actually get your CD, can't they?
96

97 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, right now I'll just have *Little Town of Bethlehem* available,
98 if anybody liked this particular song, and they want to download it,
99 they can come to our website, Alhambra Dental, and you'll be able
100 to find it on there and download it and get this particular piece, I'll
101 add other pieces during weeks to come.
102

103 **Salvador Gaytan:** Okay, before the Christmas Season.
104

105 **Dr. John Chao:** Before the Christmas Season is over.
106

107 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yes, okay. We don't want this going into the 4th of July or
108 something, okay?
109

110 **Dr. John Chao:** I'll have something else by then.
111

112 **Salvador Gaytan:** Okay, well...
113

114 **Dr. John Chao:** So, Merry Christmas everybody.
115

116 **Salvador Gaytan:** Now, coming up a few shows from now, we're going to have the
117 New Year's and you have some very interesting resolutions, which
118 you're not going to share right now, but you have some very
119 interesting resolutions that you are going to share with the
120 audience, come a few weeks from now, aren't you?
121

122 **Dr. John Chao:** Well, I'm still thinking about it.
123

124 **Salvador Gaytan:** You're still thinking about it, come on now.
125

126 **Dr. John Chao:** It's not totally defined yet.
127

128 **Salvador Gaytan:** We're going to get it out of you, it's very interesting. He's got
129 some big goals on his plate coming up for 2010, but we're going to
130 get to that later.
131

132 **Dr. John Chao:** Actually, I'm waiting for some good news actually.
133

134 **Salvador Gaytan:** Some good news, huh? Well, okay. Now, Dr. John, let's get to our
135 -- we're going to get to Tiger Woods here in a second, but let's get
136 to our Rapid Fire Five, which is more entertainment based, and a
137 little bit of dentistry. Are you ready, Dr. John?
138

139 **Dr. John Chao:** Yes, let's go.
140
141 **Salvador Gaytan:** Okay, I'm going to ask you five true or false questions, you're
142 going to say whether it's true or false, and we're going to get to
143 some interesting details here. Question number one: The word
144 dentist is of Italian origin, true or false?
145
146 **Dr. John Chao:** That would be false.
147
148 **Salvador Gaytan:** That is false, okay. Question number two: The phrase 'Long in the
149 Tooth' originated with horses, true or false?
150
151 **Dr. John Chao:** That's true.
152
153 **Salvador Gaytan:** That is true. Question number three: Teeth are made of 100%
154 enamel only, true or false?
155
156 **Dr. John Chao:** That'll be false.
157
158 **Salvador Gaytan:** That's false. Question number four: The term Bluetooth comes
159 from a 10th century king, true or false?
160
161 **Dr. John Chao:** It's true.
162
163 **Salvador Gaytan:** That is true.
164
165 **Dr. John Chao:** It's not really from a blue tooth.
166
167 **Salvador Gaytan:** No.
168
169 **Dr. John Chao:** So, that tooth does not need a root canal.
170
171 **Salvador Gaytan:** That's right, no root canal for the tooth. It's really a 10th century
172 king, okay. Question number five: The phrase 'Wisdom Teeth'
173 refers to a person's maturity, true or false?
174
175 **Dr. John Chao:** Yes.
176
177 **Salvador Gaytan:** True, okay. You'll tell us why. Okay, let's get to question number
178 one: The word dentist is of Italian origin, that's false. Why is that
179 false?
180
181 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, it's really a French word, from the word dent. The French
182 were quite developed in dentistry in the past centuries, and they
183 imported quite a bit of their technology to America, and America
184 has developed its own brand of dentistry, somewhere along

185 different lines, but the French have always been known for their
186 dentistry, so the word dentist actually came from the French.
187
188 **Salvador Gaytan:** That is...
189
190 **Dr. John Chao:** We owe that to the French.
191
192 **Salvador Gaytan:** That is – are they still, are the French still more advanced in
193 dentistry or the world caught up to them?
194
195 **Dr. John Chao:** They're pretty good, they're pretty good. Their system is different
196 from ours. The dental profession is separate from medicine in
197 America, but in Europe and in France, of course, dentistry is part
198 of medicine, it's actually a specialty of medicine.
199
200 So, when you want to become a dentist, you actually go to medical
201 school first. You study a number of years and then you take your
202 specialty as a dentist. So, in that sense they're a little bit different
203 from ours, and so theirs is more the MD turning to be dentists as a
204 specialization.
205
206 Whereas in America, our education in the first two years is very
207 basically medical along with some dental, and in the last three or
208 four years, then it's concentrated on dentistry itself.
209
210 **Salvador Gaytan:** So, how long does it take for -- how long did it take for you, once
211 you decided to be a dentist -- well, after you got your bachelor's
212 degree, how many years did it take for you to become a dentist?
213
214 **Dr. John Chao:** It took four years.
215
216 **Salvador Gaytan:** Four years.
217
218 **Dr. John Chao:** Four years, yeah, generally speaking, it takes four years.
219
220 **Salvador Gaytan:** That's not too bad.
221
222 **Dr. John Chao:** No, no, it's not too bad at all.
223
224 **Salvador Gaytan:** Okay. Question number two: The phrase 'Long in the Tooth'
225 originated with horses. That is true, Dr. John.
226
227 **Dr. John Chao:** That is true, because the saying originally started with horses.
228 Horses' teeth will continue to grow as they get older, even though
229 it gets worn. So, as they get older, the gums start to shrink away
230 from the tooth and the horses' teeth will look longer and longer,

231 and that's one of the ways a person can tell how old the horse is,
232 and then people also notice that as they get older, their teeth look
233 longer for probably two reasons.
234
235 One is, sometimes the gums do recede in human beings around the
236 front teeth. The other reason is that gum disease can take hold,
237 especially in the old days, and when that happens, the teeth will
238 extrude and actually grow longer. So, you see people with severe
239 gum disease, one tooth will be longer than others.
240
241 **Salvador Gaytan:** So, the tooth is coming out of the socket?
242
243 **Dr. John Chao:** Actually, coming out of the socket, getting longer and longer and
244 every week I see people coming in with one front tooth longer than
245 another and we try to save those teeth and do different techniques
246 to save them and reshape them and so on.
247
248 So, it's quite an interesting process. So, then over time, if you see
249 somebody with long tooth compared to what you remember him as
250 being before, then you say, "Oh buddy, you're getting long in the
251 tooth. That means you're getting older".
252
253 **Salvador Gaytan:** Getting older, so long in the tooth is not good.
254
255 **Dr. John Chao:** Getting older buddy. Long in the tooth is a nice way of saying,
256 "Well, you know, the times are catching up with you".
257
258 **Salvador Gaytan:** Actually, you can really tell in horses, how old they are by their
259 teeth.
260
261 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah.
262
263 **Salvador Gaytan:** Interesting.
264
265 **Dr. John Chao:** But you can't tell by people, except you can sometimes tell by the
266 wear on their teeth.
267
268 **Salvador Gaytan:** Interesting.
269
270 **Dr. John Chao:** To a certain extent.
271
272 **Salvador Gaytan:** Okay, question number three, Dr. John: Teeth are made of enamel
273 only. That's false.
274
275 **Dr. John Chao:** Well, it's false, but what you generally see is enamel. It's the outer
276 hard mineralized casing around the tooth. Inside the tooth is a

277 softer material, organic material called dentin. Dentin is basically
278 tubular in structure and there are little nerves in it.
279
280 So, if you put something hot or cold on your tooth, those nerve
281 endings will send the signal to your brain that this is cold or hot.
282 As your tooth wears down, then your teeth can become more
283 sensitive. That's when people brush and brush harder.
284
285 **Salvador Gaytan:** They wear down; you mean there's less enamel on the tooth?
286
287 **Dr. John Chao:** Less enamel, it's from decay or the over brushing of your teeth and
288 the roots of the teeth show, and the roots are made out of dentin, so
289 the dentin will give you sensitivity to hot and cold, especially to
290 cold.
291
292 So, the tooth is made out of the outer casing, which is enamel, and
293 the inner casing called dentin and in the middle of the tooth is a
294 chamber that's filled with nerves and blood vessels, and that's
295 called the pulp. So, a tooth is made up of enamel and dentine and
296 pulp.
297
298 **Salvador Gaytan:** Interesting, fantastic. For anyone just tuning in, you're listening to
299 SmileTalk. I'm Salvador Gaytan here with Dr. John Chao, the
300 friendly dentist from Alhambra Dental. You can reach Dr. John at
301 AlhmabraDental.com or 626-308-9104. In just a few minutes,
302 we're going to chime in on Tiger Woods, his smile and his -- and
303 you have some prime advice for Tiger, but we're going to get to
304 that. We have two more questions.
305
306 **Dr. John Chao:** Yes, okay.
307
308 **Salvador Gaytan:** Okay. Question number four on the Rapid Fire Five: The term
309 Bluetooth comes from a 10th century king. That is true.
310
311 **Dr. John Chao:** That's actually true, he was called Harold Bluetooth, and because
312 this technology was developed around where he had lived.
313
314 **Salvador Gaytan:** In Sweden.
315
316 **Dr. John Chao:** In Sweden, and so they named this technology after him, because
317 he had unified the country. So, when this particular technology
318 came about, which brought computer technology into the phone,
319 then they decided to name it after him, because he had unified his
320 country and this is a unified technology that was applied to the
321 telephone and to our present age, but apparently he didn't have a

322 blue tooth such as what you get when you get hit. So, I was
323 jokingly saying that he doesn't need root canal.
324
325 **Salvador Gaytan:** Maybe...
326
327 **Dr. John Chao:** Maybe he did, maybe that's why they call him Bluetooth.
328
329 **Salvador Gaytan:** That's true, we got to...
330
331 **Dr. John Chao:** King Bluetooth.
332
333 **Salvador Gaytan:** We have to investigate that.
334
335 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, I think chances are he didn't have a blue tooth.
336
337 **Salvador Gaytan:** He didn't have a blue tooth. Maybe it was just a -- or maybe it was
338 a -- I don't know, who knows?
339
340 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, if somebody walks into my office, has a blue tooth, this is
341 automatically root canal time.
342
343 **Salvador Gaytan:** Root canal, huh?
344
345 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah.
346
347 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, that is interesting. Okay, question number five: The phrase
348 'Wisdom Teeth' refers to a person's maturity. That is true, in a
349 way, isn't it?
350
351 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, chronological maturity, not necessarily his wisdom or his
352 intelligence. So, you got your wisdom teeth between the age of 15
353 to 25, and when you get them, then you have lived a certain
354 number of years. So, supposedly then you're wiser in your ways
355 than when you were younger, so that's why it was called wisdom
356 teeth.
357
358 **Salvador Gaytan:** And the wisdom teeth are the third or second molar?
359
360 **Dr. John Chao:** It would be the last, it'd be the third molar.
361
362 **Salvador Gaytan:** Third molar.
363
364 **Dr. John Chao:** Third molar, and a lot of people wish they don't have it, most of
365 the time it gets extracted, because they don't come out straight. So,
366 it's a better part of wisdom not to have that.
367

368 **Salvador Gaytan:** Better part of wisdom not -- yeah, are there any people...
369
370 **Dr. John Chao:** [Crosstalk] wisdom teeth.
371
372 **Salvador Gaytan:** Are there any people you ever see that the wisdom teeth just didn't
373 grow in?
374
375 **Dr. John Chao:** Once in a while, you see somebody without any wisdom teeth.
376 They're absent totally from the beginning. So, those are the lucky
377 ones. Once in a while I get a big guy with big jaws and the teeth
378 would be straight.
379
380 **Salvador Gaytan:** Wow, so then you don't take them out.
381
382 **Dr. John Chao:** No, no, then you wouldn't have to.
383
384 **Salvador Gaytan:** Wouldn't have to.
385
386 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah.
387
388 **Salvador Gaytan:** Interesting, interesting. Okay, Dr. John, we're in the spirit of
389 entertainment and making the show a little bit broader in addition
390 to dentistry. We are going to talk a little bit about Tiger Woods.
391 He's got a little problem, but he has made a lot of money with a
392 great smile.
393
394 **Dr. John Chao:** Definitely. That's one of his trademarks.
395
396 **Salvador Gaytan:** One his trademarks.
397
398 **Dr. John Chao:** He smiles really broad and he has just a very innocent, charming
399 smile.
400
401 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yes.
402
403 **Dr. John Chao:** You like him when you look at him.
404
405 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yes.
406
407 **Dr. John Chao:** So, that just shows how much a smile can mean to a person.
408
409 **Salvador Gaytan:** Absolutely.
410
411 **Dr. John Chao:** We work with it all the time. Every day we work on people's
412 smiles and we see lives change, personality change. It could be an

413 older person, now with a new denture. Now, he's smiling really,
414 really big, his life changes.
415
416 Or somebody who decided, after all, after living with a kind of a
417 less than perfect smile, they wanted to be made over, they want the
418 smile made over, and we do it. We see tremendous changes for the
419 good, and it's one of the most pleasurable things I do as a dentist,
420 to do that.
421
422 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, speaking of change, I think right now Tiger Woods' wife
423 would like to see a little change in his alleged behavior.
424
425 **Dr. John Chao:** Yes, I wouldn't imagine he's smiling as big as he normally does.
426
427 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, at least not reportedly on thanksgiving evening, as you
428 know, late in the evening somehow he wound up in a little auto
429 accident in his driveway, he ran over a fire hydrant, a tree. His wife
430 somehow or another smashed two windows in his car. Now,
431 allegedly it seems like she might have been chasing him.
432
433 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, when I first heard it, I couldn't imagine how somebody who
434 can putt 20, 30 feet, 50 feet and not miss a hole, cannot miss a fire
435 hydrant.
436
437 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, that is true.
438
439 **Dr. John Chao:** That's really, really strange to me, and until I really heard more
440 and more, that how did the guy back out and hit a fire hydrant?
441
442 **Salvador Gaytan:** That is true. Yeah, now there are a lot of details we don't know, we
443 may never know, so we're just kind of speculating on what's been
444 reported, but there is a little irony in the fact that a man, he's made
445 a lot of money on his smile, and also swinging a golf club. He
446 might have been chased down his own driveway by his own wife
447 swinging one of his clubs.
448
449 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah and then smashing his smile in his face.
450
451 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, yeah maybe.
452
453 **Dr. John Chao:** Allegedly.
454
455 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yeah, maybe, maybe, maybe getting a piece, because he had a
456 little, some scrapes and so forth, but -- so I guess he's had these
457 little [xx] or whatever, but we have some advice for Tiger Woods
458 to help him in his future.

459
460 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, I got a couple and you've got a couple. You got a few, right?
461 So, let's hear yours.
462
463 **Salvador Gaytan:** Exactly, exactly. Well, let's see, I would say for starters, is around
464 the house, lock up all the golf clubs, okay? Nobody's touching golf
465 clubs except him, that'd be number one. What about you?
466
467 **Dr. John Chao:** Like guns, you put it in the cupboard and you'll put a lock on it,
468 right?
469
470 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yeah, absolutely. I will say, I mean she definitely had a pistol, she
471 was breaking the windows either to help him or to get at him, or
472 whatever it was, but breaking a window, that takes a little effort.
473
474 **Dr. John Chao:** Now, how did they know that she was going after him with a club?
475
476 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, they don't know. That's one alleged story, and the other
477 story from Tiger's camp is that he was dazed in the truck and the
478 door was locked, and so she broke the windows to get him out.
479 That's...
480
481 **Dr. John Chao:** So, she smashed -- so, she conveniently brought a club. She must
482 have rushed out of the house with a club in her hand with the
483 purpose of smashing the windows to get him out.
484
485 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, yeah, she said she heard the accident, in the papers, and then
486 she ran out and saw him and then, A, I guess couldn't get him out
487 and, then she ran back in the house to get a golf club and broke the
488 two windows to get him out.
489
490 **Dr. John Chao:** Wow.
491
492 **Salvador Gaytan:** That's a good wife, huh, maybe.
493
494 **Dr. John Chao:** Well, {it seems like you have} broken the club.
495
496 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, she wasn't worried about that one, she wasn't worried about
497 that one. So, what's your piece of advice for Tiger?
498
499 **Dr. John Chao:** Actually, I recommend two things for him.
500
501 **Salvador Gaytan:** Okay, shoot.
502
503 **Dr. John Chao:** Before he gets back into the house in the future, he should put on
504 his mouth guard.

505
506 *Salvador Gaytan:* Professional mouth guard?
507
508 *Dr. John Chao:* Yeah, well, custom made by his dentist. He should have a
509 bodyguard.
510
511 *Salvador Gaytan:* Yes, 24 hour body guard.
512
513 *Dr. John Chao:* I actually mean that he should put on something.
514
515 *Salvador Gaytan:* I see.
516
517 *Dr. John Chao:* Put on his mouth guard and whatever it is that he can put on his
518 body to protect himself.
519
520 *Salvador Gaytan:* Well, it's like boxers, somebody -- they put on a cup, you know
521 what I mean? So, that would be good.
522
523 *Dr. John Chao:* You could have somebody hired or you can actually wear a device.
524
525 *Salvador Gaytan:* That's true, that's true.
526
527 *Dr. John Chao:* So, I recommend mouth guard and bodyguard.
528
529 *Salvador Gaytan:* Mouth guard and bodyguard. Okay, I think that's pretty good.
530 Now, let's see what else we got for old Tiger. I would say, his
531 Escalade was pretty beat up. We saw the pictures, the window is
532 out, the tires are -- so, I say for his next vehicle, he invest in some
533 bulletproof, shatterproof glass in the windows. So, if he gets in that
534 car, nobody is going to break a window, no matter what.
535
536 *Dr. John Chao:* That's true, that's true. He should buy one of those cars that has a
537 camera in the back, so he knows to avoid fire hydrants when he's
538 backing up.
539
540 *Salvador Gaytan:* Well, that's true, but you know what? I think that he was actually
541 pulling forward in the reports.
542
543 *Dr. John Chao:* Oh, he actually was going forward?
544
545 *Salvador Gaytan:* Actually pulling forward, which makes you wonder, I mean if
546 you're pulling forward and like you say, you can make...
547
548 *Dr. John Chao:* I thought he was backing up to get...
549

550 **Salvador Gaytan:** No, he was going forward, yeah. That makes it a little bit more
551 tantalizing in the fact that how does a guy, who can make long
552 distance putts, not miss that fire hydrant? He had to have someone
553 rattling his cage most likely, right?
554
555 **Dr. John Chao:** I think he lost it, maybe momentarily for whatever reason.
556
557 **Salvador Gaytan:** He lost it for a moment, and I would say another little advice, he
558 might want to enroll in a little bit of, I don't know, boxing or self
559 defense to keep the dukes up when he needs to.
560
561 **Dr. John Chao:** At least protect himself.
562
563 **Salvador Gaytan:** That's exactly, protect himself.
564
565 **Dr. John Chao:** There's no way you can protect yourself, you cannot protect
566 yourself from a...
567
568 **Salvador Gaytan:** A wife scorned?
569
570 **Dr. John Chao:** From an enraged lady.
571
572 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yeah, that's true.
573
574 **Dr. John Chao:** You wouldn't even dare.
575
576 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, that is true. All he can do is cover up.
577
578 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, that's right, yeah.
579
580 **Salvador Gaytan:** Cover up. Now, for Tiger Woods' wife, if she was really -- if she
581 was mad at him, which we -- there's conflicting reports, but if she
582 was mad at him, I would say a better piece of advice, if she really
583 wanted to get him back, she could do something and do you have
584 any idea what that is?
585
586 **Dr. John Chao:** I have no idea.
587
588 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, she's taken -- apparently if this is true, if she was mad at
589 him, she was taking a golf club and hitting his nice Escalade, right?
590 She was trying to, right, but most guys, that would really hurt, beat
591 up on their prized car.
592
593 For him, his prized putter, she just needs to break his putter.
594 Because you know what, his putter, what I've read is, I've heard
595 through the grapevine is, he's made a lot of money with that putter.

596 He loves that putter, yes, and he has tried to duplicate it, but has
597 had a hard time getting a second one to feel the same way.
598
599 **Dr. John Chao:** Now, you speak from experience, don't you?
600
601 **Salvador Gaytan:** That is correct.
602
603 **Dr. John Chao:** Don't you have a custom made putter yourself?
604
605 **Salvador Gaytan:** I have custom made clubs myself, I play a lot of golf, and so yeah,
606 I know how when you get a favorite club, that thing breaks or goes
607 missing, it's hard to duplicate it.
608
609 **Dr. John Chao:** So, what about just smashing his trophies?
610
611 **Salvador Gaytan:** Trophies...
612
613 **Dr. John Chao:** Does that mean anything anymore? He's [crosstalk].
614
615 **Salvador Gaytan:** I don't think that's really going to get him. That's not really -- he
616 can replace trophies.
617
618 **Dr. John Chao:** Well, I got an idea, if she really wants to get him, whether she's
619 serious or not, she ought to talk to Gloria Allred.
620
621 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, that's, I think one of the...
622
623 **Dr. John Chao:** I think she's in the news now, right?
624
625 **Salvador Gaytan:** One of his reported first flames has hired Gloria Allred to defend
626 her, I don't know, defend her...
627
628 **Dr. John Chao:** I think that will worry him more.
629
630 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, that is true. She's known for being a tigress.
631
632 **Dr. John Chao:** Who's known to be a tigress?
633
634 **Salvador Gaytan:** Gloria Allred.
635
636 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, yeah, that's right. I think Tiger would have met his match
637 with Gloria Allred.
638
639 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yes.
640

641 **Dr. John Chao:** So, Tiger and tigress can get it going a few rounds, that would be
642 very interesting.
643
644 **Salvador Gaytan:** Maybe we shouldn't be giving Tiger's wife these ideas.
645
646 **Dr. John Chao:** I'm sure she's real smart, she wouldn't need us.
647
648 **Salvador Gaytan:** That is true, that is true, that is true. Now, it just came out though,
649 that apparently there is a second mistress reportedly that came out
650 too. Now, two in the span of a week, Dr. John. He's got more -- I
651 mean, you talk about the term 'Being in the Rough', hitting your
652 ball in the trees. I mean he's in a double rough here.
653
654 **Dr. John Chao:** Well, more may come out. What do you think of that?
655
656 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, it is a possibility.
657
658 **Dr. John Chao:** If you have two, what are the chances of having three or four or
659 more?
660
661 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, it is true, because of temptation, Dr. John. He got married
662 young, I think too young. He got married young...
663
664 **Dr. John Chao:** How old was he?
665
666 **Salvador Gaytan:** He's 33 right now, and he's been married for about five years. He
667 was married about 27, 28.
668
669 **Dr. John Chao:** But that's not too young.
670
671 **Salvador Gaytan:** That's too young.
672
673 **Dr. John Chao:** For you maybe.
674
675 **Salvador Gaytan:** For me, it's that -- see, if he would have come to me for advice, I
676 would have said, "Listen, don't get married, just have fun, enjoy
677 your career, maybe about 40 or so", that would have been my
678 advice to him.
679
680 **Dr. John Chao:** I don't know. He's too eligible.
681
682 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well...
683
684 **Dr. John Chao:** Too eligible to last until he is 40.
685
686 **Salvador Gaytan:** But he wouldn't have been in this pickle.

687
688 **Dr. John Chao:** It's not too bad, I'm sure they'll...
689
690 **Salvador Gaytan:** He's got beautiful kids and everything, but who wants to be in this
691 pickle?
692
693 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, that's not nice.
694
695 **Salvador Gaytan:** So, do you have any other advice, Dr. John, that you would like to
696 impart on him. I mean, you've been single for a while, so you
697 know about marriage, by the fact that you didn't get dragged into
698 it.
699
700 **Dr. John Chao:** Well, I got close.
701
702 **Salvador Gaytan:** You got close?
703
704 **Dr. John Chao:** A couple of times.
705
706 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yeah, you did.
707
708 **Dr. John Chao:** A couple of times, but I didn't quite make it, though I am really in
709 no position to advice anybody on marital affairs, I have no
710 experience.
711
712 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, maybe you're in the position by the fact that you avoided the
713 pitfalls.
714
715 **Dr. John Chao:** Possibly, possibly. So, it's better to love than never to love at all.
716
717 **Salvador Gaytan:** Yes.
718
719 **Dr. John Chao:** But I did love and love lost. So, that's past experience.
720
721 **Salvador Gaytan:** That's right, that's right.
722
723 **Dr. John Chao:** Past experience.
724
725 **Salvador Gaytan:** Well, Dr. John, we're coming to the end of our show. It was a
726 fantastic show, interesting show and we do have, like you say,
727 we're going to keep a little light this December aren't we?
728
729 **Dr. John Chao:** I enjoy just chit-chatting, and this is what we talk about when we
730 sit down and talk.
731
732 **Salvador Gaytan:** That's right.

733
734 **Dr. John Chao:** And about different things and I enjoy it, it's good.
735
736 **Salvador Gaytan:** Fantastic.
737
738 **Dr. John Chao:** I think we'll keep it light from now on.
739
740 **Salvador Gaytan:** Absolutely.
741
742 **Dr. John Chao:** At least for the rest of the month.
743
744 **Salvador Gaytan:** For the rest of the month, because it's a holiday month.
745
746 **Dr. John Chao:** Yeah, right.
747
748 **Salvador Gaytan:** Alright, well that concludes our show for this week, and we will
749 see you next week.
